Use the trail on this old map of Carlisle and the photo clues to follow in Tullie Mouse's steps. I wonder what you'll find out along the way?

1 Look up! What animal can you see?

It's holding a scroll with the city arms on it and is facing towards Scotland. What sound does this animal make? Shout your answer loud enough for us to hear you in the Tullie Pop Up Museum!

Tullie Mouse has made a friend!

There are several of these heads (called grotesques) on this building, which has been here for over 600 years! These jolly jesters however, were actually added in the Victorian era to make the building look more 'old'!

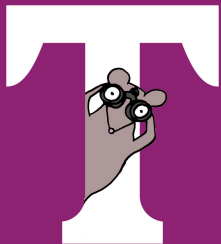
How many jolly jesters can you count?

Which building stands behind Tullie Mouse?

Stand on this building's north side (the side facing the road) and find where Tullie Mouse took his picture. Can you spot anything odd about the wall? There are lots and lots of bullet holes! These were made by muskets during the Jacobite occupation of Carlisle in 1745, possibly for target practice. Get on your horse and gallop to the next point on the map!

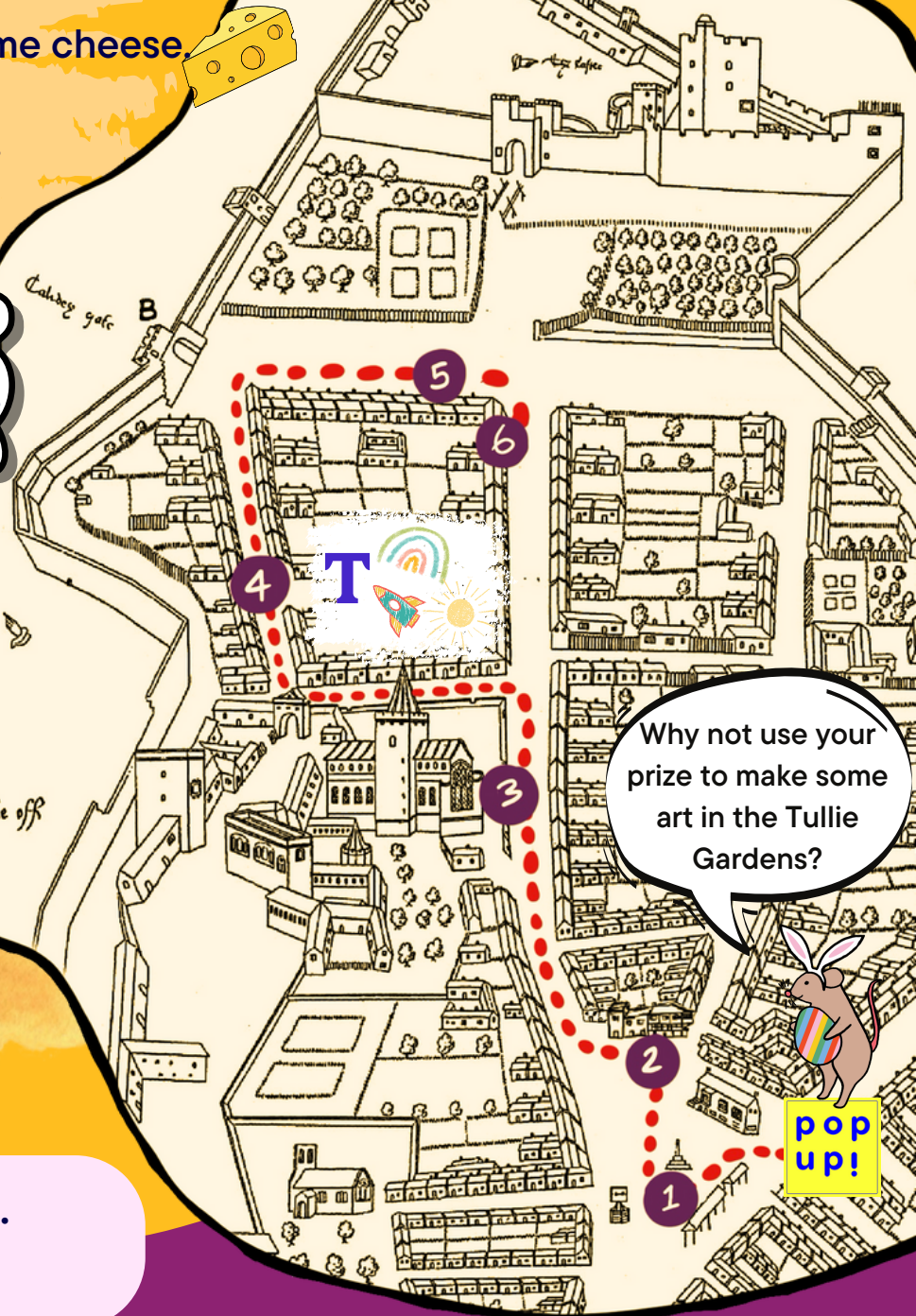
What magical creature can you see?

This is Carlisle's coat of arms (crest) and the motto is "Be Just and Fear Not" - although Tullie Mouse would be a little fearful if those dragons were real! They're called 'wyvens' - a type of dragon said to have a poisonous tail. The words "be just and fear not" are actually from a play written by the famous Shakespeare. What do you think they mean?

How many roses can you count on this crest?
