

Carlisle Gallery Access Guide

After you've got your entry sticker from Reception, the Carlisle Gallery is the first gallery you will enter. It's straight ahead of you.



On the left just before you access the gallery, are the toilets including an accessible facility too. There're other accessible loos around the museum as well.



The Carlisle Gallery is on the ground floor with level access and is entered through this doorless opening. It's also the way you get to the rest of the museum.



There are friendly Gallery Engagers in the space to answer questions and help if you need it.



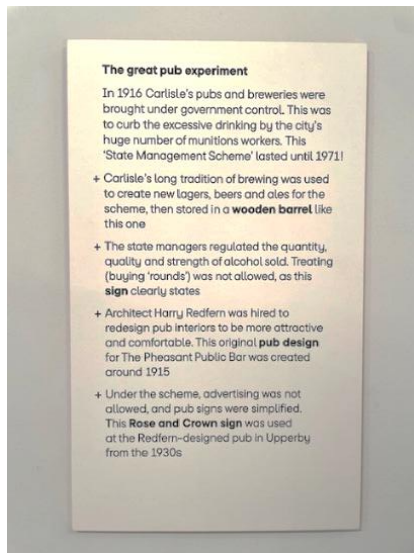
The space is light and bright. It's open with space for wheelchairs and powerchairs.



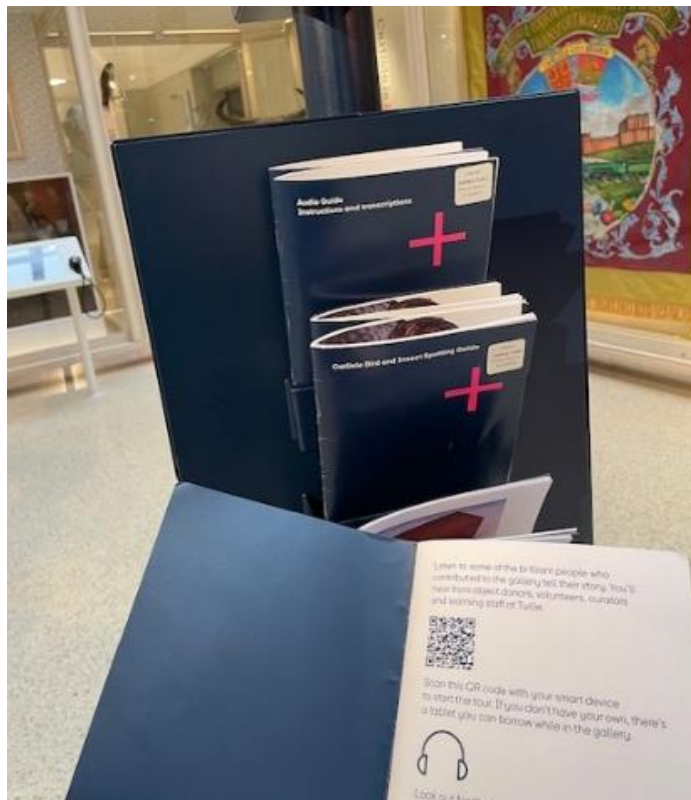
Sensory activities are available around the poles in the centre of the gallery.



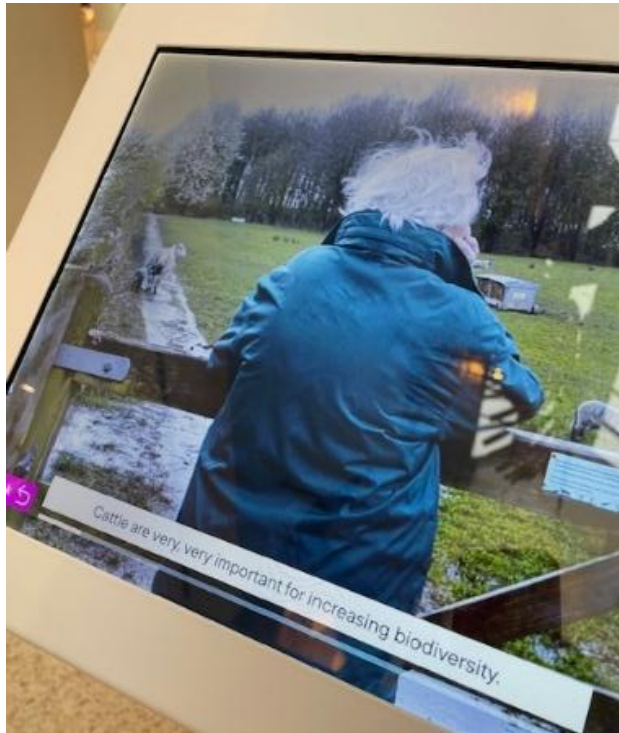
The stories are told using text panels and labels with a 28 point font.



There's an audio guide with stories about 12 objects. You can listen to these using your own device and scanning the QR code in the Audio Guide booklet. If you don't have your own, we've a device you can use, just ask the Gallery Engager.



All the videos have subtitles.



Seating is available in the gallery, on the centre benches, where you can also view the Changing photography screen, and stools that you can move around the space. If you'd like a portable stool to take with you around the museum, ask a Gallery Engager.



The Resilient themed space inside the drum is darker, smaller and has a continuous loop of folk music and sound effects playing. There's bench seating in here for rest or reflection.



You can visit the rest of the museum by heading towards the large red T at the exit of the gallery.
